You will receive relevant industry-driven content and a firm foundation in the principles of ethical commerce and social responsibility. You will also have the option to major in Accountancy or Finance and will complete an honours thesis in the final year of your degree.

Majors

ACCOUNTANCY

Accountancy is about providing reliable, timely and accurate information for decision makers, especially for economic decisions. Topics include financial reporting, auditing, management accounting and information systems in accounting. You will learn about financial accounting in its organisational, social and political contexts, as well as study relevant law subjects (including taxation law and law of business organisations) to be eligible for associate membership of professional accounting bodies.

FINANCE

Finance is about money and investments. People on their own and in partnerships, companies and other entities (including state and federal governments), have a common objective of profitable investment. You will learn the theoretical knowledge and tools demanded by employers in all sections of the world economy: investment, financial markets, financial modelling and portfolio analysis. You will explore corporate finance, including financial strategies, security analysis and portfolio management.

A Bachelor of Laws from UOW equips you with a comprehensive legal education: a world-class degree that provides a thorough grounding in the law, as well as a real-world focus on the essential practical skills and the social and ethical context in which the law operates. In the Bachelor of Laws you will study Criminal Law, Constitutional Law, International Law, Environmental Law, Litigation & Practice Skills/Internships, Human Rights, Family Law, Business & Financial Law, Contracts, Property Law, Torts, Commercial Law, Legal Ethics, Intellectual Property, Jurisprudence, Taxation, and many other legal subjects and skills. You will also learn relevant industry-driven content as part of your Commerce degree gaining a firm foundation in the principles of social responsibility, and ethical commerce.

ECONOMICS

Economists are interested in the behaviour of consumers and business firms; the labour market; health care; the environment; technology and innovation; economic growth and development; monetary and fiscal policy; international trade and finance; and the global economy.

You will study both macroeconomic and microeconomic theory with an emphasis on policy and its effect on working economies. You will look at what determines supply and demand for various goods and services, how prices are determined, consumption and investment patterns, international influences on the economy, the role of government within the economy, and money and interest rates.

FINANCIAL PLANNING

Financial planners must have an understanding not only of finance but of accounting, management and marketing. Financial planning is the design of specific financial outcomes that meet a client's unique needs and objectives, given their financial resources and risk profile. You will investigate securities and the market they operate in as well as theories of the market and the equilibrium prices of securities. You will learn how to assess investments, and the method for identifying the best financial product for a client, with particular attention to their risk profile.

HUMAN RESOURCE MANAGEMENT

People are an organisation's most valuable resource. Human Resource Management (HRM) is concerned with finding the right people for an organisation and, having employed them, nurturing them so that they want to stay and perform to the best of their abilities. Specific focus is placed on the acquisition and development of employees, positively influencing their employment performance while monitoring and managing the processes of staff selection, retention and turnover.

HRM examines specific people management practices, such as recruitment and selection, organisational behaviour, employee relations, management of change, learning and development, and workplace health and safety management.

INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS

International Business is about understanding business in other cultures and regions, and learning how to think globally about the business world. You will learn how to manage across cultural boundaries in an international business context, having gained knowledge of international human resource management and trade environments. You'll improve your understanding of leadership, strategy, cultural diversity, communications and decision making as they relate to contemporary international business issues.

MANAGEMENT

Management is the art and science of planning, coordinating and leading group efforts. It is the mobilising of human and material resources to achieve organisational goals. You will learn how to strategically manage both physical and intangible assets for organisational success and employee wellbeing. You will do this by gaining a sound understanding of the framework of organisational structures, including the local and international environments in which they operate.

MARKETING

Marketing is the activities, institutions and processes for creating, communicating and delivering products and services. This includes facilitating relationships to deliver value for consumers, clients and society. It's about everything from establishing who the customer is to developing a competitive advantage by effectively positioning products and services in the market. You will study how consumers behave, how organisations find out about their markets and the customers in those markets, how to create effective marketing communications campaigns, and how organisations manage marketing successfully.

PUBLIC RELATIONS

Public Relations (PR) is about managing information between private and public spaces – between organisations and stakeholders, individuals and the public, or a combination of these. The key is effective communication and the way this information is planned and executed. You will learn how to communicate effectively with internal and external stakeholders using a range of media. A PR major teaches you how to evaluate the cultural and organisational contexts, key trends and ethical issues influencing contemporary PR, and to critically evaluate the role of PR in society and organisations.

SUPPLY CHAIN MANAGEMENT

Supply Chain Management is concerned with the entire life cycle of a product or service, from before it is made, to how it is disposed of, and how it moves between each stage. As well as goods and services, supply chain managers analyse and manage information from the suppliers, through intermediaries, to the customer.

You will learn the principles and tools associated with operations management and continuous quality improvement. You will also gain an understanding of total supply chain management, systems thinking and simulation and strategic management.

Bachelor of Commerce Global – Bachelor of Laws (Honours)

You are not able to directly enrol in this degree. If you are interested in undertaking Honours in law, you must have completed at least 124 credit points of compulsory law subjects. You must also have achieved a weighted average mark (WAM) of 70% or more based on all 100 and 200 level core LLB subjects. Consideration will be given by the School of Law in exceptional cases where the required WAM has not been achieved. Entry must be approved by the Head of School, in consultation with the LLB Honours Coordinator and your proposed supervisor.

As part of this degree you will focus on the theoretical foundations and practical approaches to computation and its applications. There is an opportunity to specialise in a major from your second year of study by choosing one of the below major options. In your third year you will develop your own application as part of an annual student team project, developing solutions to real-world problems provided by our industry partners. In your final year you will complete an honours thesis.

Majors

BIG DATA

Big data can solve problems in science, society and business, including population growth, transport, security, medical technology, trade and commerce. All sectors will have a demand for creative people with a background in quantitative analysis who can look for strategic insights in massive data sets, using techniques in data mining, data visualisation, data analysis, data manipulation and data discovery. You will study subjects in data mining, big data management, database performance tuning, distributed systems and cloud computing.

CYBER SECURITY

Cyber security has been identified as one of the strategic priorities in Australia to meet the demands of law enforcement, national and state governments, defence, security and finance industries. Jobs of the future will be in all of these areas ensuring there is national capability to maintain and build essential services and stop them from being disrupted, destroyed or threatened, and that our personal information is not communicated, shared, visualised or analysed without our permission.

In this Cyber Security major you will study technical and political concepts of current topics in cyber security, such as blockchain, cryptocurrency, multimedia security, Internet of Things (IoT) security, obfuscation and reverse engineering. You will learn penetration testing skills for defensive purposes and be prepared for ethical hacking certification.

DIGITAL SYSTEMS SECURITY

Information and systems security is becoming increasingly important for everyday life: we want technology to protect our digital information such as IDs, assets and data security, and to secure email and online privacy for individuals, homes, families and offices.

The Digital Systems Security major focuses on the theoretical and practical applications of information and digital security across a range of subjects, including: operating systems security; file and data protection; heterogeneous computing; systems architecture; cryptography and its secure applications; and network and telecommunications security.

GAME AND MOBILE DEVELOPMENT

The Game and Mobile Development major has been designed to meet the current global demand for skilled graduates in the areas of game and multimedia system development. This major will equip you with skills to apply techniques to the development of video games and related systems on computers and mobile platforms, including devices such as mobile phones, tablets and wearable devices. You will be able to identify approaches to solving real-world problems in video games and multimedia systems. In addition, you will develop both traditional computer science skills as well as creative skills, including visualisation, interaction and communication skills. Experts in this field work in the entertainment industry, the game and mobile industry in Australia and worldwide as mobile application developers, game programmers, animators, game engine developers, mobile entertainment and multimedia designers.

SOFTWARE ENGINEERING

Software Engineering incorporates all aspects of software production, including business strategy, design, coding, testing, quality and management of large-scale complex software systems.

You will study a wide range of programming principles and software development methodologies, processes, problem-solving concepts and maintenance for automated system. You will also learn software engineering principles and practices to plan, design and develop high quality and complex software systems.

Internships

Multiple internships are a fundamental component of each UOW Global degree.

You will emerge with strong practical, interpersonal and professional skills. Coupled with the soft skills and intercultural experience from your overseas study, you will be positioned among the most-sought after graduates in the world. A UOW Global degree is your stepping stone into the job market.

You will complete your internships with companies who are leaders in their field. The most up-to-date list of internship companies can be accessed at coursefinder.uow.edu.au/golead

Industry representatives will be actively involved in the organisation of internships, including interviews and selection of students, as well as the development of placement projects. As part of the internship application process, you will be required to submit a cover letter and resume, complete psychometric testing and video interviews, as well as attend a face to face interview. You will be able to nominate a company preference, however, final allocation to a partner will be based on your performance during the internship recruitment process. You will receive dedicated support from Faculty of Business staff who can coach you through the application and interview process as well as provide guidance throughout your global degree. Students will complete all three internships with the same company.

In addition to the industry placement component, each internship subject will include reflective learning tasks and modular assessments. For students undertaking Honours research you may choose, with Faculty approval, to work with your industry sponsor in deciding on a research project.

In 2021, you will have the opportunity to undertake a year of study at UOW's teaching locations in Singapore, Hong Kong and Dubai.

With almost 6,000 students, UOW College Hong Kong (UOWCHK) is recognised as a premier college in Hong Kong, in close association with the City University of Hong Kong.

STUDENT LIFE AND SUPPORT

On arrival, UOW students will be provided with an orientation program and will be paired with local student buddies. UOWCHK staff members will act as formal channels of support and care. Students will have access to the Telford Recreation Club sporting facilities and library resources.

FLIGHTS AND ACCOMMODATION

In 2021 return flights and accommodation* for all enrolled global degree students will be paid for by the university for the duration of each semester at each UOW teaching partner. Students will spend approximately 3.5 months in each location. Accommodation will be twin-share and the style of housing will vary from country to country.

* The university will cover the initial cost of flight tickets and accommodation only. Any additional costs incurred, for example, flight change fees, damage to property or missing items, will be the responsibility of the student.

How to apply

UNIVERSITIES ADMISSIONS CENTRE (UAC)

Year 12 students from all states and territories can apply for the Bachelor of Commerce Global (Honours), Bachelor of Computer Science Global (Honours) and the Bachelor of Commerce Global – Bachelor of Laws via UAC.

Please note: all students applying for the Bachelor of Commerce Global (Honours) and Bachelor of Commerce Global – Bachelor of Laws degree will need to submit a written application and undertake an interview. Instructions on how to do this will be emailed to each applicant.

UOW EARLY ADMISSION 1 - 30 August 2019

Current Year 12 students can apply directly via the UOW Early Admission program. Applications open on 1 August and close on 30 August. Interviews for successful candidates will be held in early October. Telephone interviews are available for students who reside interstate or a significant distance from Wollongong.

Students selected for an Early Admissions interview will need to submit a written application prior to interview. Instructions on how to do this will be emailed to each student selected for an interview. Students who meet the indicative criteria for entry into the Bachelor of Commerce Global (Honours), Bachelor of Computer Science Global (Honours) and the Bachelor of Commerce Global – Bachelor of Laws and are successful at interview will be issued with a conditional successful outcome pending achievement of an entrance ranking equivalent to an ATAR of 95.

The courses listed in this guide have limited places. The ATAR – SR listed for each course is the minimum rank needed for consideration and does not provide guaranteed entry. You may meet the rank listed using your ATAR (or equivalent) alone or your Selection Rank.

ATAR + ADJUSTMENT FACTORS = SELECTION RANK (SR)

ATAR ADJUSTMENT FACTORS

To calculate a Selection Rank, current Year 12 students can be awarded adjustment points (bonus points) towards their ATAR for the Bachelor of Commerce Global (Honours), Bachelor of Computer Science Global (Honours) and the Bachelor of Commerce Global – Bachelor of Laws in the categories shown below. Adjustment factors are calculated and administered by UAC on behalf of the University.

CATCHMENT ADJUSTMENTS

If you went to a school in the UOW's local area, or in regional NSW, you may be eligible for three catchment adjustment points.

SUBJECT ADJUSTMENTS

With Subject adjustments, you can earn up to a maximum of 3 points by excelling in relevant Year 12 subjects. If you complete your HSC in the year prior to university admission, receive an ATAR and do well in relevant subject, you're eligible. The list of subjects that qualify for Adjustment points can be found at uow.edu.au/future/pointstouow

Please note: Subject Adjustment Points are not on offer to Bachelor of Commerce Global (Honours) or Bachelor of Commerce Global – Bachelor of Laws applicants.

EQUITY ADJUSTMENTS

High school students who have experienced long-term educational disadvantage can receive up to five adjustment points. To be eligible for consideration your educational performance must have been seriously affected, normally for a period of at least six months during Year 11 and/or 12 or equivalent, due to circumstances beyond your control.
